IELTS Writing Test 1:

- Task 1: The table shows the positions held by woman in government and management in five different countries in 2000.
- Task 2: It is more important for school children to learn about local history than world history. To what extent do you agree or disagree?

- Task 1: Pie Chart
- Task 2: Many museums and historical sites are mainly visited by tourists but not local people. Why is this the case and what can be done to attract more local people to visit these places?

IELTS Writing Test 3:

- Task 1: Maps
- Task 2: Nowadays, more and more people read news on the internet. However, newspapers have most of important information sources of news. Give your opinion from your experience and give examples.

IELTS Writing Test 7:

- Task 1: 3 pie charts
- Task 2: More and more people would like to pay more attention to the famous people who have achieved huge success in areas, such as cinema, sports. Why they attract much interest from people? Do you think it good or bad?

IELTS Writing Test 8:

- Task 2: Some people think that it is good for a country's culture to import foreign movies and TV programmes. Others think that it is better to produce these locally. Discuss both views and give your opinion.

IELTS Writing Test 10:

Writing task 1 (a report): We were given a diagram showing the participation of boys and girls in different sports. We had to make a comparison and describe the diagram.

Writing task 2 (an essay): Nowadays the differences between countries are becoming less evident because we see the same TV shows, advertisements, fashion and follow the same brands. To what extent the advantages of this trend outweigh its disadvantages?

IELTS Writing Test 11:

Writing task 1 (a report): We were given two maps of the same housing estate, the first was of its current state and the second after the redevelopment that will take place in the near future. We had to describe and compare the two maps.

Writing task 2 (an essay): Many people believe that schools should teach children to become good citizens and workers rather than independent individuals. To what extent do you agree or disagree? Give your own opinion and relevant examples.

IELTS Writing Test 12:

Writing task 1 (a report): We were given a line graph describing different crimes committed in England and Wales between 1970 and 2005. We had to summarize and explain the graph.

Writing task 2 (an essay): Students in schools and universities learn more from their teachers than through other means such as the Internet, libraries and TV. To what extent you agree or disagree?

IELTS Writing Test 13:

Writing task 1 (a report): We were given a bar chart showing the percentage of exported bananas in 1993 and 2003 by growing regions such as Africa, Latin America and South Asia. There was also a pie chart showing the cost of banana export in 2003 with breakdown by regions.

Writing task 2 (an essay): Some people believe that anyone can create art such as painting, poetry, music and so on. Others think that a person should have special abilities to create art. Discuss both views and give your opinion.

- Task 2: It is impossible to help all people in the world, so governments should only focus on people in their own countries. To what extent do you agree or disagree?

Writing task 2 (an essay): Some people think that there is a great influence of news media on people's lives and this is a negative development. Do you agree or disagree with this statement? Give your opinion and relevant examples.

IELTS Writing Test 19:

Writing task 1 (a report): We were given a double line graph describing birth and death rates from 1900 until 2010 and a projection for 2050 in one European country.

Writing task 2 (an essay): Some people say that computer games are bad for children by all means, others believe that these games are contributing to children's development. Discuss both views and give your own opinion.

IELTS Writing Test 20:

Writing task 1 (a report): We were given a table showing the best ranking universities in the world from different countries. We had to summarize the information.

Writing task 2 (an essay): Nowadays businesses face problems with new employees who just finished their education and lack some interpersonal skills such as the ability to work in a team. What do you think is the main cause of the problem? How can it be resolved?

IELTS Writing Test 21:

Writing task 1 (a report): We were given two pie charts showing the percentages of energy produced from different resources such as natural gas, coal and so on, in one country over a period time. We had to summarize and describe them.

Writing task 2 (an essay): Some people believe that international trade and communication with other countries is a positive trend, while others think it is harmful to nations and they might lose their identities. To what extent do you agree or disagree with this statement? Give your own opinion and relevant examples.

IELTS Writing Test 22:

Writing task 1 (a report): We were given a table that described the prices of six different items (milk, newspapers, petrol, hamburgers, concert tickets and TV sets) in 1981 and 2011 and the percentages of price change. We had to compare them.

Writing task 2 (an essay): Some people think that governments must insist on preserving traditional appearance of old buildings undergoing renovation or redevelopment. To what extent do you agree or disagree with the statement?

IELTS Writing Test 23:

Writing task 1 (a report): We were given three pie charts showing the percentage of students attending different courses such as Arts, Science and so on in 2010 divided by age groups 18-24, 24-40, 40+. We had to summarise the information by selecting and reporting main features and make comparisons where relevant.

Writing task 2 (an essay): Some people believe that it is impossible to help everyone in need around the world. That is why governments should only focus on helping people of their own country. To what extent do you agree or disagree with this statement? Give your own opinion and relevant examples.

- Task 1: Table
- Task 2: It is observed that in many countries not enough students are choosing to study science subject. What are causes? And what will be effects on society?

IELTS Writing Test 25:

- Task 1: Pie charts.
- Task 2: In developing countries, children in rural communities have less access to education. Writing task 1 (a report): We were given a line graph showing the number of people living in rural areas in four different countries.

Writing task 2 (an essay): Nowadays university education is very expensive. Some people say that universities should reduce their fees, especially for the less fortunate students or those coming from rural areas. To what extent do you agree or disagree with this statement?

IELTS Writing Test 29:

Writing task 1 (a report): We were given a map of the USA on which there were four pie charts in four different parts (North East, Middle part, South and West) showing the agricultural land used in different ways (Animal use, Forests, Crops, Other uses). We were asked to describe how the agricultural land is in use in the USA.

Writing task 2 (an essay): Some believe buildings should be built in a way that serves their purpose rather than just look beautiful. Others, however, say buildings should represent art too. Discuss both views and give your own opinion.
